

Qualifying For Coquille Valley Golf Tournament To End August 31

August 31 has been set as the last day for qualifying for the 1952 Coquille Valley country club golf tournament. The meet is open to anyone who turns in a qualifying round.

Defending spring handicap champions are Chet Noyes and Mrs. Al Petrie.

Trophies will be given to the champions and winners of the lower flights. Eight men's and four women's trophies will be awarded.

The eight lowest qualifiers will be placed in the championship flight and others in subsequent flights according to their scores. All preliminary matches will be 18 holes with the finals set over the 36-hole distance.

The former Portland infielder boasts a .421 mark while Frank Burdell, who had topped the circuit in recent weeks, slipped to second just a shade behind with .420.

"Jeep" Stetter and Dick Wenner of Coos Bay-North Bend and Bill Burgher of Bandon remain very much in the running for the title. Stetter has an average of .418, Burgher .408 and Wenner .407.

Coquille's Dick Ament is now eighth with a mark of .388. Tom Hunt and Don Hinchberger are other Loggers listed in the charmed .300 circle with .318 and .314 respectively.
