

Mrs. J. Barton And Inez Rover Named To State Offices At BPW Convention

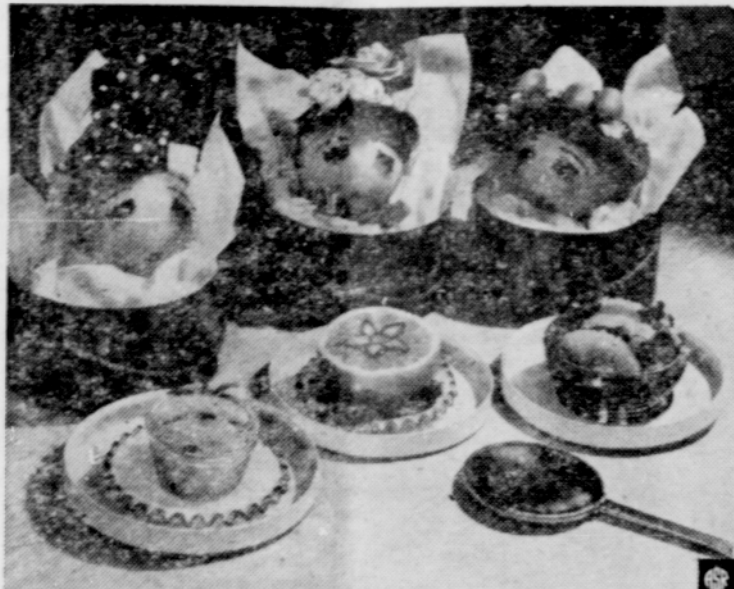
Mrs. J. S. Barton and Miss Inez Rover were elected to state offices in the Oregon Federation of BPW at the convention held last weekend at Grants Pass.

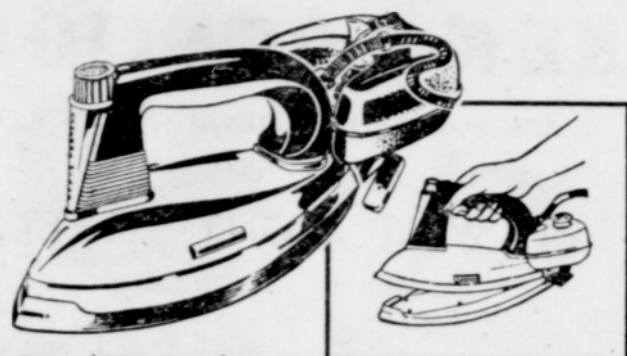
