A schedule of examinations for all aircraft and custom ground applicators of herbicides (weed killers) for licensing required under the 1953 agricultural herbicide control law has been announced by Frank McKenney, chief of the division of Plant Industry, state department of agriculture.

John R. Thielen, local county extension agent, has made the arrangements for examinations in this county. They will be held in the county extension office Tuesday, May 26, beginning at 1:30 p.m. Also, for those interested, there will be a discussion of the herbicide laws, spray recommendations, and opportunities in the custom spraying field.

Ray Kelso of Salem, who is supervisor of the law for the department of agriculture, will conduct the examination.

Hoyt Herd Joins Rank Of Winners

Two registered Jersey cows owned by H. A. Hoyt, Myrtle Point, have received special recognition for their outstanding production records made on Herd Improvement Registry test.

Royal Kola Glow produced 8,692 lbs. milk containing 511 lbs. butterfat at the age of 2 years and 10 months, and Western Valley Beauty produced 8,668 lbs. milk containing 538 lbs. butterfat at the age of 2 years and 2 months.

In terms of production records made at a mature age of 6 years on a twice-daily-milking, 305-day basis, these records both exceed 600 lbs. butterfat.

The official tests were made under supervision of Oregon State college for The American Jersey Cattle club, Columbus, Ohio.
