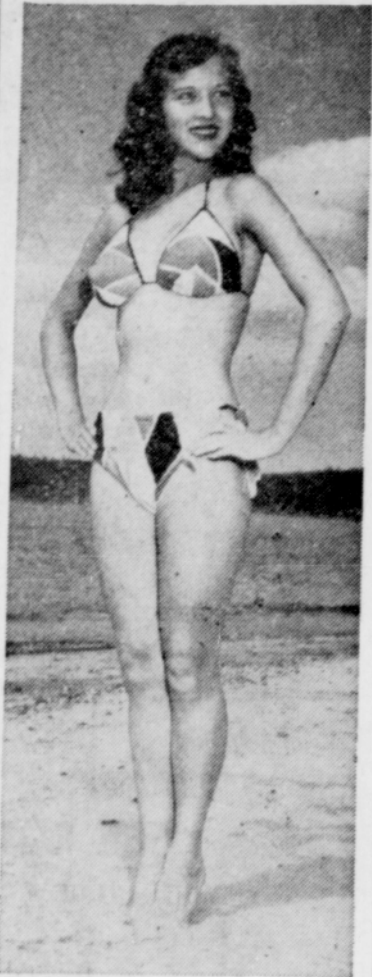

In the interest of economy, good government and good practice, a program of better publicity on measures, that have been submitted to the voters, is indicated. On the local level, money would have been saved, had money been spent, to acquaint the voters with the reasons why various measures are desirable, essential, or in some cases, mandatory. As a result of the lack of adequate information, we have, on occasion, the unfortunate situation of an unfavorable vote for a measure, or service, or funds for some endeavor, that is vital to the public good. These "no" votes, in such cases, can only be the result of inadequate presentation of the facts. Another election is then required and dissemination of information on the proposal. Time and money would have been saved had this been done in the first instance. Legislators and civic leaders should be cognizant of the fact that the general public has not had the advantage of impartial discussion and debate on these proposals and, when they are in doubt, will cast a "no" vote on the principle that "no" vote is a safe vote.

Our genial editor and publisher, Ralph Stuller, has a pet project, perhaps, because he is an ardent disciple of Izaak Walton, perhaps, because it is a darn good idea and needs being done. It is the development of the recreational possibilities of the Coquille river—boat launching facilities, picnic areas, boat houses, etc. You, who have pursued your favorite sport upon the river, know it to be difficult of access, if not impossible, through most of the navigable length of it. To one who has a new boat and motor and the yen to fish, it is exasperating to be unable to find a launching spot. Fishing is a place of the soul and aids in the contemplation of the finer things of life. It should be encouraged—never frustrated.

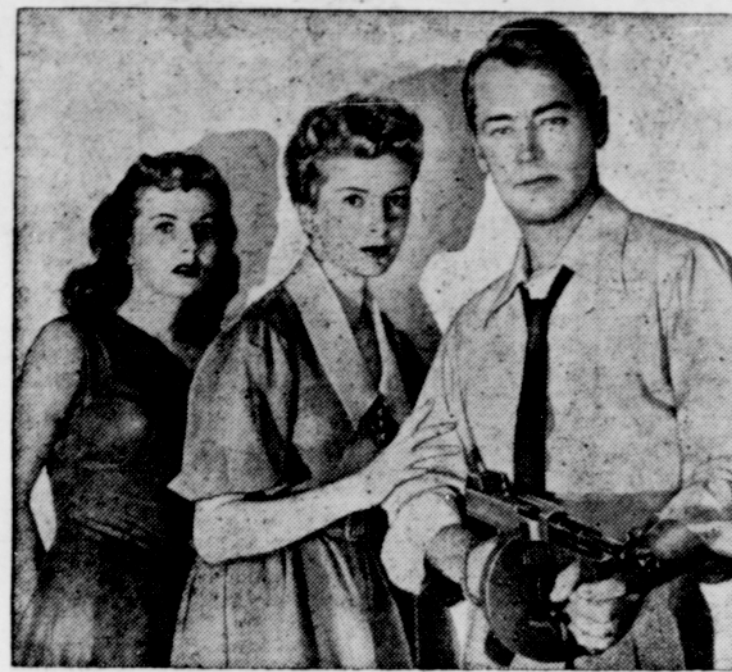
Miss Kistner, received her award for improvement based on two years work in American history and social economics. Molthu received his pin for improvement in the study of American history.

### Grade Schoolers Make 10 Points In Track Meet

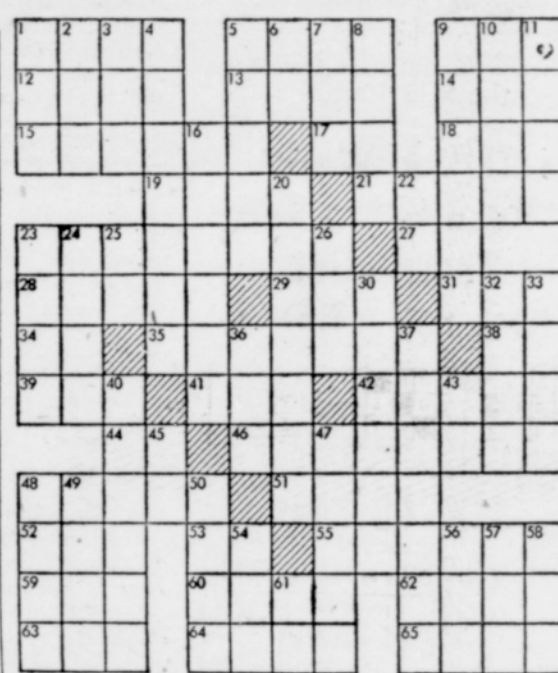

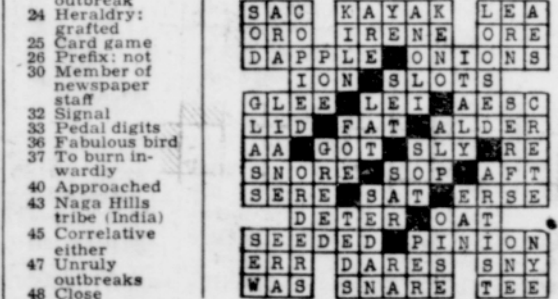
