**Engineers Hear Flood Problems**

R. Jaren and A. L. Cox, civilian engineers from the Portland district office of the Corps of Engineers, were told of the Coquille Valley's water problems when they met January 14 with flood control committees of the Coos, Polk, and Clatsop counties. The meeting was held at the Coos County Extension office in the new courthouse.

After hearing of the flood problem faced by Coquille Valley farmers, Cox and Jaren stated that Congress has authorized a full

study of the problem. However, no money has been appropriated as yet for the study.

After the study is completed and a report filed, Congress must give its approval to it and a money appropriation to do the work.

The Portland men said that the Army engineers can only do what they are authorized to do. They feel that it may be a long time before money is available for effective flood control, power, industrial water supplies and other phases.

The committee will meet again March 4 at Coos Bay. The time and place will be announced at a later date.
