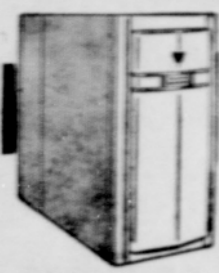

Homemakers Plan Special Dishes

A festival means a celebration. A cheese festival would then mean to celebrate with cheese. October has been designated the Cheese Festival Month.

Let's celebrate by serving old, new or different cheese dishes.

Cheese is a good food for it is from milk. Milk is the most nearly perfect food we have. There are many kinds of cheese. In fact, some 400 cheese are recognized by name today, but they represent variations of only about 20 distinctly different kinds of cheese. Through carefully controlled, scientific processes, cheesemakers in the United States have been able,

within the past 100 years, to reproduce successfully nearly all foreign types such as Swiss, Camembert, Limburger, Blue and Parmesan. In addition, they have originated several distinctively American varieties such as brick, cream and jack cheese.

With fruit in the background and glasses of cold milk, here is a cheese snack that will appeal to everyone. Remember, most cheese is its flavor-best when served at room temperature. It is easier to handle, too!

CHEESE DATE NUT LOAF

(Makes 1 loaf)
 1/4 cup boiling water

1/2 pound dates, chopped
 2 tbsp. butter
 1 1/4 cups flour, sifted
 1/4 tsp. salt
 1 tsp. soda
 1/2 cup sugar
 1 egg, well-beaten
 1 cup cheddar cheese, grated
 1 cup walnuts, chopped.

Pour boiling water over dates and butter. Let stand for five minutes. Sift together the dry ingredients. Add cooled date mixture, beaten egg, cheese and nuts. Mix only until blended. Scrape mixture into well-buttered one pound loaf pan. Let stand 20 minutes. Bake in moderate oven, 325 F. for 50 to 60 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center of the loaf comes out clean. Turn out on rack to cool. It is best to make this bread a day in advance for easy slicing.
