Red Devils Cinch League Leadership In Thrilling Contest Friday Night Downing Bandon By 19-6 Score

Coquille's Red Devils took the key game Friday night with a strong and plucky Bandon high eleven to secure the Red Devil's commanding control of the league again this year. Final score was 19-6.

In the middle of the first quarter Jack Jacobsen finished up a 98-yard march with an eight yard end sweep to give the Red Devils their first score.

Toward the end of the first quarter Eddie Sanders playing a heads-up ball game scooped up a Bandon fumble and returned the oval for 44 yards, and it was short shrift then for another touchdown.

With the score 12-0, Jacobsen made a perfect goal kick and added the extra point.

With less than two minutes to play in the first quarter Coquille Red Devils finally moved ahead again with another touchdown making the score 19-0; and then the Bandon Tigers came to life to start a rally in the final seconds of the game.

A pass from Walt Ashton connected with Mike Carver who made 35 yards on the play and two yards from the Red Devils goal-line. Carver then plunged over for the first touchdown of Bandon, and the horn blew shortly after.

The game was Bandon's first loss of the season.

Powers Cruisers Take N. B. Juniors

POWERS — Gary Hess, moving from center to halfback for the play, went high in the end zone to pull down a "backetball" pass in the last six seconds of the game here Saturday afternoon to give Powers an 18-12 decision over North Bend's junior varsity.

The maneuver ate up the last four yards of a 61-yard drive to break a 12-12 tie and broke a three game losing streak for the Cruisers. They now have won two games. The loss was the second for the North Bend Jayvees who have two wins and a tie.

Powers scored its first touchdown in the initial quarter with a 32-yard pass, Larry Gunn to Punk Smith.

The visiting Bulldog jayvees rolled back in the second quarter to tie the score at halftime with John Schnick ending a 54-yard march with a four yard plunge.

The Cruisers moved ahead 12-6 by using most of the third quarter for a 66-yard march which saw Smith take Gunn's pass for the last 12-yards.

North Bend came back for the equalizer midway in the last quarter. Schnick crossed the goal line with a three-yard burst for the score.

Then mixing the attack with passes and runs for fair gains, the Cruisers stormed to the four-yard line where Gunnon tossed to Hess for the winning TD.
