GEORGE CARLSON U.S. ARMY AIR FORCE

Navigator on B14. Served in the European Campaign (based in England) and African Campaign based in Dakar.

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CLIFFORD N. CAFFEY U.S. ARMY

22 Jan. 1941 - 22 Nov. 1945

Corporal, Field Lineman, Mess Sgt. Served in Alaska Unak Island. Headquarters Battery 75th Artillery.

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HAROLD THOMAS CAFFEY U.S. ARMY

1943 - 1945

T. 5. Armored Division. Served in Europe.

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PRESTON CLAY CAFFEY U.S. ARMY

22 Oct. 1940 - 19 Dec. 1945

Staff Sgt. Signal Corp. Served in the Asiatic Pacific Theatre.

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DARALD "Andy" ANDREWS U.S. NAVY

Andy served in the Experimental Gunnery Ordinance at Patuxent, Maryland. He had two brothers, one serving in the Philippines and the other one in the European Theatre. Andy had joined on his 17th birthday and was not sent overseas. He was in the Navy for four years.

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JOSEPH EDWARD FRYE

U.S. ARMY AIR FORCE
19 Sept. 1942 - 18 Dec. 1945

Pvt. 874 Guard Sq. AAF Infantryman.

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WILLIAM FRANK MILLER U.S. ARMY

Sept. 1942 to April 1943

Served as Private Quartermaster Detachment. He was drafted at the age of 42 years. He served at Camp White, Medford, Oregon. No overseas duty.

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WILLIAM "Bill" TUCKER U.S. NAVY

June 1942 to Nov. 1945

Served in the American Theatre, Asiatic Pacific, Philippines, Guadalcanal, Okinawa, Tokyo and Iwo Jima.

Bill was one of several young men enlisted in the Navy from Eastside, Oregon under the title of Pearl Harbor Avengers in 1942. He served on the tanker, USS Neches which fueled Admiral Halsey's 3rd fleet, 1st fleet tanker into Tokyo Bay at the Japanese surrender.

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DONALD A. HULL JR. U.S. ARMY

Nov. 1942 - 19 Nov. 1945

Served in European, Africa, Middle Eastern Theatre, Rhineland and Central Europe. Helped to liberate prisoners in Germany. Was horrified at how terribly thin they were and still walking.

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ERNIE ROLLINS U.S. ARMY AIR FORCE

26 Feb. 1942 - 18 Jan. 1946

Instructor for cooks and bakers, some photography. Served in the states and the Aleutians. Recollections were being 60 miles downwind from the 1st atomic bomb test explosion. Being the only survivor of a plane crash and clawing dirt on hands and knees to get away from plane before it exploded injuring my back. Fighting Japanese from a plane in the Aleutian Island.



WILLIAM R. CLARKE U.S. ARMY

May 1944 - Oct. 1946

Captain in the Infantry. Was a supply officer for Gen. McArthur. Served in California, Texas, and Japan. Received an Army Commendation Ribbon from the office of the Commanding General for meritorious service in Japan from 9 Dec. 1945 to 16 Feb. 1946.



RICHARD LEONARD GETRUM U.S. NAVY

19 Sept. 1942 - 18 Dec. 1945

Motor Machinist Mate 1st Class. Served in the European Campaign (based in England) and African Campaign based in Dakar.



JOHN M. HUFF U.S. NAVY

3 Feb. 1943 - 9 Oct. 1945

Naval Aviator. Served in the Atlantic Ocean.



ROBERT "BOB" WILSON U.S. COAST GUARD

June 1942 - March 1946

Fire Fighting Specialist. Served in San Francisco, Portsmouth, VA, Manbattan Beach, New York and Honolulu, Hawaii.
