U.S. NAVY SEABEES

Oct. 1942 - 1944

Construction equipment operation. Awarded the Good Conduct Medal, American Theater Ribbon, Asiatic Pacific Area Ribbon, Philippine Liberation Ribbon, Victory Ribbon and the European African M. E. ribbon Point System.

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DALE DALRYMPLE
U.S. MARINES

1943 - 1946

Served in the South Pacific. Wounded in action.

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HARRY CLYDE LILLIE
U.S. NAVY SEA BEES

1942 - 1945

Construction. Served in New Hebrides in the South Pacific. He got awfully tired of lamb, ram or mutton because it always ended up mutton. (per wife)



HAROLD SIMMONS
U.S. ARMY

Apr. 11, 1944 to Nov. 3, 1945
Repairman. Served in Europe and the South Pacific.

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DELBERT B. STEELE
U.S. ARMY

11 Sept. 1942 - 8 Dec. 1945
HQ. DET. WASC. Served in North Africa - Gold Coast.

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DANIEL S. BARKLOW
U.S. ARMY

23 Aug. 1942 - 2 Dec. 1944

Infantryman H&S Co. 132nd Engr. Combat Bn. T/5 77th Division. Served in the South Pacific. The best thing for me while I was in the Army were "my boys". They were all ages, 18 to 25, some a little older. I was 20 years older than most of them. In fact, I was over 40 years old then. All the boys called me "Pop"! I was there when a Japanese gunman opened fire on a jeep and Ernie Pyle was killed along with his driver. (From his memoirs).



GEORGE W. ALBERTSON
U.S. NAVY

Dec. 1945 - Jan. 1946

Motor Machinist 3rd Class. Served in Asiatic Pacific, and European African Middle East. A Japanese suicide plane down the ships smoke stack and ended up on a life raft.

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DELOS EDWARD HOFFMAN
U.S. NAVY

1943 - 1946

Ship's cook. Stayed in service 28 years.

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FOREST J. LAFLAMME
U.S. ARMY

1942 - 1945

10th Mountain Ski Division. Quote: "I'm a dog-robber for the old man" (colonel's runner). He served in Italy, Battle of the Po. *He became ill in Italy. While he was in the hospital someone took his place. His replacement was killed in battle.



GERALD LILLIE
U.S. NAVY

1943 - June 1946

Took on 2000 POWs on their ship. They were in bad shape. He served in the South Pacific.

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CHARLES WILSON
U.S. MARINES

Sept. 1942 - Nov. 1945

Amphibious Tank. Served in Saipan, Tinian, Iwo Jima and South Pacific.

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JERRY ANDERSON
U.S. NAVY

Submarine duty.

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JAMES HOOVER
U.S. ARMY

15 June 1942 - 10 June 1946

78th Infantry Div. Co. K 309 Inf. Served in Europe and was severely wounded. Participated in the Battle of the Bulge at Remagen Bridge, Germany. They kept the Germans from coming through and by this action shortened the war.
