I realize that the office of Commissioner is a most important one, and therefore I think it is the right of every voter to know something of the man who wishes to fill this office.

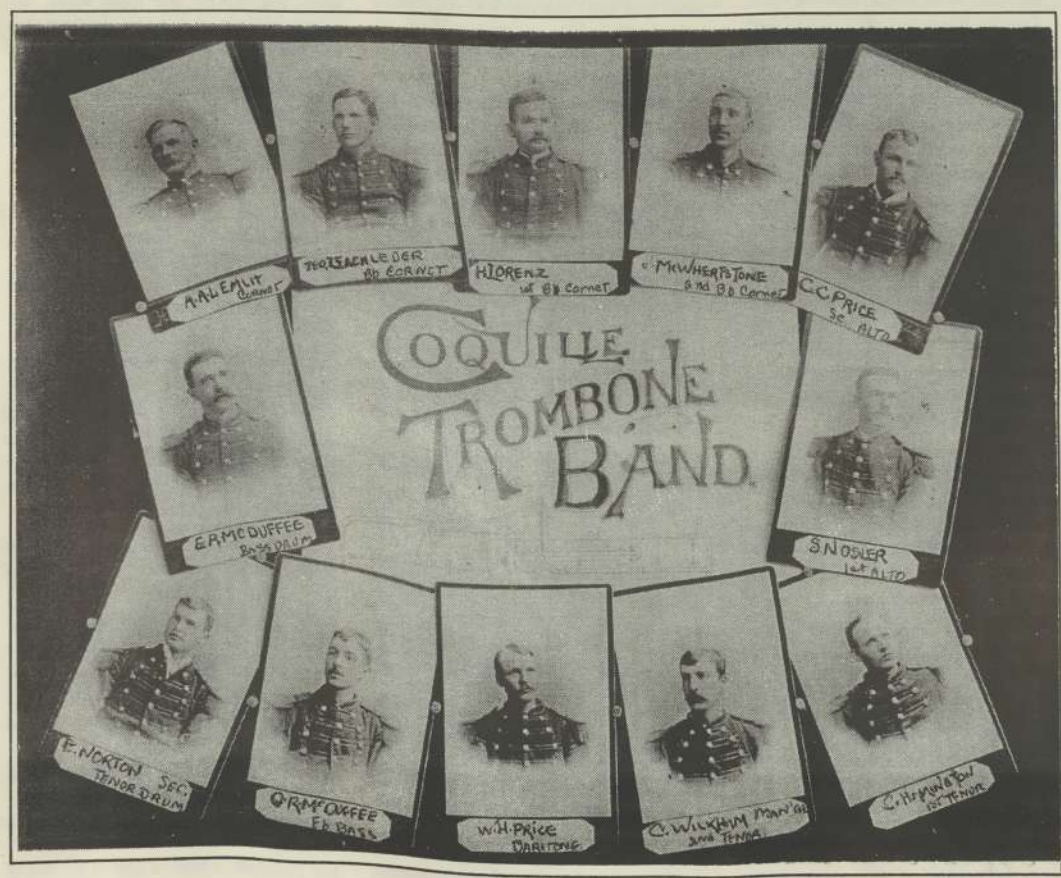

Coos County Court Records 1896-98, Page 137

Whereas there is a probability that the county seat of Coos County will be relocated, J.W. Leneve, Master of Chadwick Lodge #68 AF & AM and B. E. Nosler, Secretary of Trombone Band here offered to lease the lower hall of the Masonic Building situated in the town of Coquille City, Coos County, Oregon for the purpose for one year at one dollar per year and S.L. Leneve has offered to lease 20 feet of the front of his drug store with his fire proof vault for the sum of \$1.00 per year for county purposes.

The court deeming it advisable at this time to consider said proposition and make preparations to remove the county seat in the event that the vote on said question at the June election be decided in favor of Coquille City, said town having secured the majority of all the votes cast on said question.

It is therefore ordered that J. Henry Schroeder and I.T. Weekly, members of the court are hereby appointed to examine said buildings in said town of Coquille City and determine if they be suitable for the purpose which they are intended as per said propositions and they are also authorized to examine other buildings in said town of Coquille City and receive proposals and report their findings to this court at its next term to wit: September 1896 term.
