Teachers Have to Answer Questions
 The University of Oregon Extension Division has sent out question and suggestions for the year ending November 1, 1918, to the different teachers in the state. These questions and suggestions are based on "How to Teach." After the reading of the book the questions by the teachers are sent to the Extension Division, where, if approved, a certificate is issued to the teacher.

The following are some of the questions asked by this department:

1. Give the main points in acquiring skill in motor control.
2. What course of training would

you consider ideal for the teacher in the rural school?

3. Why should the teacher be sure the material as presented to the pupils be first time be absolutely correct?
4. Describe a case of a "spoiled child." What factors operating in the home seemed to be responsible for this?
5. Under what condition is talebearing justified?
6. What are the objections to "cramming?" How would you advise children to prepare for an examination?
7. For what do you give examination?
8. What are some of the methods by which moral instruction can be given in the schools?
9. Is student self government feasible and desirable in high school? Reasons? What plan can you suggest for putting it into effect?
10. What changes if any do you think would be necessary before a school could be described as a modern school?

Football With Marshfield.
