City School Notes.

Mr. O'Reilly, assistant high school teacher, Mr. O'Reilly, assistant man from O. A. C., addressed the high school Wednesday morning at 11:30. He seemed to bring the problem of the great war home to high school students and to make them more fully realize their obligations to their country. The principal part of his address was directed to high school students, telling them how they could assist in winning the war. The boys, he said, as an example, might work in the woods for the purpose of producing spruce for the various needs of the government while the girls might do sewing for the Red Cross or canning of food for our boys at the front. He said that one year meant a million lives and that the one great fear of our boys in France today was that of starving.

Mr. O'Reilly emphasized the fact that men alone going to France can not win the war but that it will take all the organized efforts of the people both here and in the trenches. He stated that the people of today were missing the true purpose of living if they existed merely for their own pleasure and not for the cause of this great war and the means by which we may end it. Unsuspecting as we may be serving the Kaiser by our thoughtless deeds and not realize it. How careful we should be then that in everything we do we serve our own government rather than any German emperor.

Students Speak on Thrift Stamps.

Speeches on thrift stamps were given by a large number of the high school students, on Tuesday morning during Assembly. The purpose of this was for the selection of the best speakers for the carrying on of the Thrift campaign. The offer of a baby bond was made by Mr. Cary as a reward for the first speaker selected for this purpose. Nellie Johnson won this prize and to address Riverton Friday, Feb. 15, in company with other Thrift campaigners.

Londy Church has agreed to sell thrift stamps in order that the high school may be represented in the "Rainbow Regiment."

Mr. Douglas intends to accompany the party of Thrift campaigners to Riverton Friday when he will deliver a talk in the interest of the campaign.

Coquille Wins From Marshfield. The high school basketball team won a closely contested game from Marshfield high school with a score of 15 to 11 last Friday night. This victory is the first won from Marshfield on their own floor in several years. Coquille now has fine prospects for the championship. A feature of the game Friday was the total lack of any "crabbing" throughout the game. A fine spirit was shown by both teams. In addition to the team there were some 35 rooters from Coquille accompanying the boys who added wonderfully to the snap of the game. After the game the boys enjoyed a swim and shower in Marshfield's splendid gymnasium.

The boys on the Coquille team were: John Stanley, center; Wm. Oerding and Howard Pike, forwards; Chas. Oeding and Fred Lorenz, guards; and Austin Clinton, substitute.

Mr. O'Reilly and Mr. Mulkey visited the grade rooms on Wednesday and spoke to the children about War Savings Stamps. Mr. O'Reilly is a government agent, from Oregon Agricultural College. He is working with boys and girls club work.
