Did Roy Swan Hide Here?

Has Roy Swan who last week gave himself up to Sheriff Gage as a slacker been hidden in the thickly forested hills back from Myrtle Point since he disappeared June 1, 1917 or has he been traveling through the west and middle west as he declares?

This is the question which is interesting Deputy Marshal Frank E. Tichenor who took the man from jail at Coquille last Saturday to remove him to Portland where his case will be tried in the U. S. Court.

Suspicion was roused in the minds of the officers by the complete vagueness of Swan's mind about his travels. He knows no date and few places. He knows but one name of an employer though he claims to have worked in many places. He is absolutely without impressions about any trip east.

He says he walked from Myrtle Point to Roseburg, starting with John Near, his brother-in-law that they left June 1st and were in Pendleton June 5th when registration took place. He had \$800 and Near had \$1,000. He has been drifting he says working a few days in many places.

The only reason he could have for concealing that he had hidden in the woods during his long absence, if such is the case, would be that Near is still there waiting to see how Swan's case comes out or that local people may be implicated in keeping the youth in hiding.

Swan is now 29 years of age but he looks older. He is the only son of G. G. Swan who lives on a ranch near Dora.

He said that Near suggested skipping out before registration for the draft took place. They did not want to fight overseas he says. Relatives of Near are said to be Socialists.—Coos Bay Times.

Tractor Turns Over Backward

A very singular fatal accident occurred near Forest Grove in this state on Monday when Rene Cropp's farm tractor fell over backwards and crushed him. The tractor was pulling a disc up a steep incline in the orchard when the machine became overbalanced and fell backward. When Mr. Cropp failed to return at noon the men on the farm went in search of him and found him beneath the tractor. He leaves a widow and three small children.

Fined For Beating His Son

Joe Barkdoll was fined \$10 in Municipal court Saturday morning for having brutally beat his nine year old son, a friend of the Bandon World. "The boy was so badly injured that medical aid was necessary. The city officials were apprised of the case with result that after a physical examination of the lad the father was placed under arrest. He pleaded guilty, stating that his temper got away with him."

Clover Best for Berries

The use of clover as a green fertilizer crop in strawberry cultivation is advocated in a bulletin issued by the Oregon Agricultural college. The advice is based on the result of tests in the upper Hood River valley by Gordon G. Brown, horticulturist, Hood River branch experiment station. The test, which covered a period of three years, was made in so-called red-shot soil.

As a general conclusion the evidence in favor of the use of clover as a green manure crop is very clear in that yields are greatly increased even on virgin soils and secured cheaply in that the need of additional fertilizer is relatively less.

Still further increases in yields are possible by the addition of commercial fertilizer, such as nitrates, which has given greatest gains. While large increases may be secured through commercial fertilizers without the use of clover, there is little evidence, says the bulletin, to support the idea that yields will compare favorably with those where clover and alfalfa manure are used as a basis.

The strawberry does its best when furnished an abundance of moisture, especially during the harvesting season. In the use of nitrate, moderation is urged.—Oregon Journal.

NOTICE TO EXTERMINATE GROUND SQUIRRELS

Every person, firm, co-partnership, company or corporation residing on, owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, building, wharf or dock infested with digger ground squirrels in Coos County, Oregon, is hereby notified to begin at once to effectively exterminate and destroy all such DIGGER GROUND SQUIRRELS.

The following poison for mixing and instructions for use thereof is the method most expedient and effective to be used for the extermination and destruction of such ground squirrels and is hereby recommended, to-wit, alkaloid strychnine used on either barley of wheat, barley preferred, mixed according to the following formula and manner, to-wit:

- Barley, clean grain 16 quarts
- Strychnine (powdered alkaloid) 1 ounce
- Bicarbonate of soda (baking soda) 1 ounce
- Thin starch paste 1 ounce
- Heavy corn syrup 1/2 pint
- Glycerine 1 tablespoonful
- Saccharin 1-10 ounce

This material should be mixed as follows: Mix thoroughly 1 ounce or powdered strychnine (alkaloid) and 1 ounce of common baking soda. Sift this into 1/2 pint of thin hot paste and stir to a smooth, creamy mass. (The starch paste is made by dissolving 1 heaping tablespoonful of dry gloss starch in a little cold water, which is

then added to 1/2 pint of boiling water. Boil and stir constantly until a clear thin paste is formed.) Add 1/2 pint heavy corn syrup and 1 tablespoonful of glycerine and stir thoroughly. Add 1-10 ounce of saccharin and stir thoroughly. Pour this mixture over 16 quarts of clean barley and mix well so that each grain is coated.

One quart of the poisoned grain mixed as aforesaid is sufficient for forty or fifty baits and this quantity scattered along squirrel trails or on clean hard places on the surface about the holes will not endanger stock. Strychnine in any form other than the powdered strychnine (alkaloid) is not effective in the above formula.

From the date hereof until May 1st is the most effective time to poison and destroy the digger squirrels, as they are just emerging from their hibernation. They are hungry and food is scarce.

The County Court of Coos County, Oregon, has secured a large amount of strychnine and the other ingredients necessary for the mixture, and a quantity thereof has been mixed and is now on sale to the farmers or persons interested at actual cost and may be had by applying to the undersigned at his office at Coquille.

If any person herein designated shall, within thirty days from the first publication of this notice, fail to begin in good faith to exterminate, eradicate and destroy, according to the method aforesaid, or by any other effective means, said ground squirrels herein designated, the County Court of Coos County, Oregon, will appoint a person or persons to proceed with the extermination and eradication of such ground squirrels, and the cost thereof incurred will be assessed to such land, building, wharf or dock, and unless paid will become a lien against the same, for the extermination of said ground squirrels.

This notice is published pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided and for two consecutive weeks or three issues, and all persons described therein are required to take notice thereof.
