

Cold Tea at \$15 a Quart

Parties from Coquille Monday were telling of a hoax worked on four liquor sleuths in Coquille Saturday. The four are said to have formerly been in North Bend and Marshfield, two being women and two men.

At Coquille, they encountered a well known Powers logger and a Greek friend and wanted to buy some liquor. It seems that the logger had seen them at Powers and recognized them. He said he would try and see what could be done to alleviate their thirst but was sure that the price would be high—probably \$15 for fifths and he couldn't guarantee the cold tea. They were willing to pay the price and would take a chance on the quality.

He framed up to get two empties and then filled them with cold tea. He had the Greek take one and he took the other. He secured \$15 and the Greek got \$15 but the logger got away while the Greek was producing his quart. The Greek was declared to be under arrest and as they were calling in the Coquille officers to round up the logger, the Greek proceeded to give them the laugh. Then they sampled the purchase and found both to be cold tea. However, they got the \$15 back from the Greek but the Powers logger with the other \$15 was not discovered.—Coo Bay Times.

Better Have Staid by the Ship

As indicating that the fifteen men who left the J. A. Chanlor at Cape Blanco in a lifeboat shortly after that tanker went on the rocks, would have been saved if they had stayed by the ship, the Port Orford Tribune says:

"An unusually heavy surf has been running and the bow end of the Chanlor was swept with the big seas. One life boat was still in the davits and it was swept loose and cast upon the beach without being badly damaged. Furniture from the captain's room was washed ashore and while the seas run over the bridge, yet the cabin, which is built of steel, is still holding. A cat, said to belong to Capt. Sawyer, was seen on the wreck. Had the men who took to the captain's boat stayed with the forward part of the ship they would have been saved."

More Fine Stock for Coos

Speaking of Noah Black's recent sale of purebred cattle on the lower Umpqua, the Reedport Courier says:

"Mr. Noah Black topped the sale with a February bull calf, a double grandson of Rosaire's Olga's Lad, at \$475. All of Mr. Black's cows brought good prices, again demonstrating the fact that it pays to buy the best of sires to head your herds with. There were grade cows that were out of Merry Golden Lad, Mr. Black's pioneer Jersey bull (which he sold and went to Coos county), that brought from \$170 to \$185."

Lane County Farm Weel Healed

A recent Eugene press dispatch says that with 1000 quarts of canned fruit on hand, enough vegetables to last until spring and hundreds of bushels of oats, wheat, corn and potatoes, the inmates of the Lane county poor farm are not worrying about the high cost of living. In fact, by selling produce, veal and chickens and such the expense of running the farm for the year ending December 15, 1919, was only \$2856.30 to the county. There are 18 on the farm now and 13 have been received and 12 discharged within the year.

An Address to Women

J. S. Lyons of the Coos Bay Iron Works, was arrested Saturday and brought up before Justice Joehnke because of not having the proper auto license on his car. In place of using a dealer's license on his cars that can be transferred from one car to another, he was making the same use of a private license.
