

When the Directors of the Myrtle Point-Coquille Cow Testing Associa-tion approached Messers Pingston & ng on the North Fork to solicit them as members for 1920 they at first declined; not because they didn't believe in Testing Association, Oh, No!, but they had purchased this herd only recently and felt that the majority of them were culls. They had never been tested.

Today the community is talki about this herd of 24 cows which made of fat and 866.5 pounds of milk. One of the cows holds 3rd place this month for fat production. Eight cows gave over forty five pounds of fat. All these cows are just grade Jerseys and when you know that all the feed they have been getting is 8 pounds of mill run and pasture. This is only another proof of the same old story, you never know until you test.

Something Besides Looks.


