**Killed Scalding Milk Bottles**  
Fatally scalded by the explosion of a sterilizing boiler at the Riverview dairy, East Thirty-fourth and Belmont streets, early Wednesday morning, Paul Eckelman, 35, died at St. Vincent's hospital at 4:30 Wednesday afternoon, says the Oregon Journal.

Eckelman was assisting in cleaning the compartment, where the milk bottles were placed for sterilization, when the supporters of the boiler gave way and he was deluged with steam. The steam burned him from head to foot, virtually cooking his flesh in places.
