Lemon Extract Kills.

The following news item from New York will be of interest to every one who is keeping tab on the results of prohibition in the United States; and it has for the editor the added interest of coming from his native town and the one in which he spent the first quarter century of his life:

Thirty souls in the vicinity of Riverhead, L. I., are assuaging their grief with lemon extracts containing from 60 to 80 per cent alcohol.

Such is the finding of the police investigating the death of Mrs. Joseph Stone, 27, in the Southampton hospital, Riverhead, from lemon extract poisoning, the symptoms of which do not resemble those of wood alcohol poisoning.

The police say that during the past few months the sale of extracts in this section increased rapidly among those not at all interested in lemons. The army was the first to recognize the deleterious effects of the extracts and forbade their sale at camps during the war and since.

Sallee Released.

S. T. Sallee, who was arrested at Marshfield on complaint of his wife and brought to Coquille to be tried for his sanity was released by County Judge Wade. Mr. Sallee was given a written release signed by the judge stating that he found no grounds to hold the man on such a charge.

Mr. Sallee was very indignant about being arrested. He said that the arrest was caused by his wife, whom he blames for the trouble. He makes counter charges against her and says that he will resort to the court.

The man denies that he kept his wife on bread and water and declares that instead he cooked her meals and took them to her when she was ill, says the Times.
