#### When The Pool Will Break

The Oregon League Dairyman for September, which came to hand a few days ago has the following in regard to pool payments in Zone Number 2, the Coos-Curry Zone:

In Zone No. 2 there was delivered by League members in July 3,172,661 pounds of milk. A small part of this milk was sold to dealers for retail distribution in Marshfield. All the remainder was made into cheese. Some of the cheese, made of July milk, has been sold. The remainder will be sold by the time this statement is in print.

Money has been received for milk sold to dealers and for some of the first July cheese sold; all will probably be paid within ten days after the last cheese is delivered.

All money received from July milk in Zone No. 2 whether the milk was sold to dealers or made into cheese will be totaled and equal payments will be made for all milk in the pool. Until all the money is paid into the League the pool cannot be closed. If part of the July cheese is not paid for within a reasonable time, partial payment will be made to all members contributing to that pool. The final payment will be made later, after all the money is received.

Not until all the money is paid and the pool closed can the actual price be determined, because the cost of operating and overhead expenses must be deducted from the total and all the net proceeds divided equally on the basis of the "pool pounds" of each member.

Likewise all the churning cream in Zone No. 2 was made into butter. The butter was all sold and part of the money received. All will be paid within another week. Most of this butter was sold in one and two pound prints.

In the near future we hope to sell butter in prints, giving the members the highest price possible, since there is always a wide margin between cube butter and print butter. Payment will be made to all members alike as soon as all the money is in, according to the actual number of pounds and quality of butter fat supplied.
