BULGARIANS MOURN LOST LANDS

Charge Berlin With Seizing Frontier Before Settlement at Paris Conference.

Paris.—The Bulgarian legation here has received the following telegram from Sofia:

"Serbian troops have crossed the frontier to occupy the territory detached from Bulgaria by the treaty of Neuilly without awaiting the consummation of the frontier and the settlement of numerous questions brought before the ambassadors' conference in Paris."

"The Bulgarian government, finding the occupation premature, protested, but to prove its loyalty it ordered the Bulgarian authorities to withdraw without resistance."

"Serbian troops entered Thraciade. All the stores were closed as a sign of mourning and three days of mourning have been declared throughout Bulgaria."

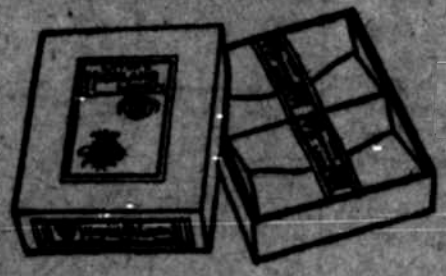
