She is a beautiful young woman and a highly talented singer, aside from the interesting attaching to her ancestry.

The evening band concerts, fireworks and frequent carnival features are specially attractive.

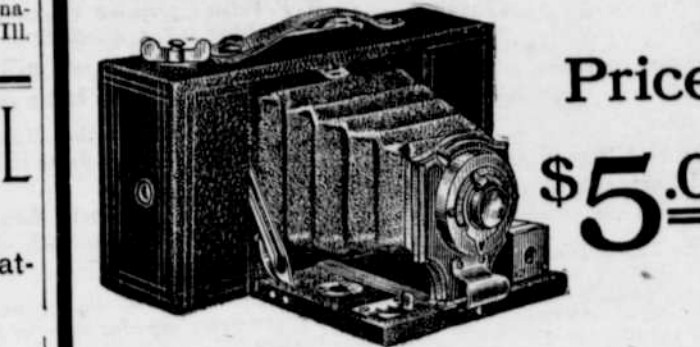
