Throughout the Winter, when work cannot be conducted to very good advantage on a wheat farm, men and teams are frequently idle for long periods, and the money that will be placed in circulation by the railroad will be of material value to the farmer, who might otherwise have no means of increasing his income until another crop of wheat was forthcoming. —Oregonian.
