## Death of Charles Binger Bunch

Fell asleep in Jesus, January 20, 1906, at the home of his parents, on Cherry creek, our dear and much beloved brother, Charles Binger Bunch. He was born in Coos county, Oregon, was the son of W. H. and Elizabeth Bunch, and was 23 years, 6 months and 5 days old. He was converted when quite young and united with the Adventist church at Gravelford. He was a student of the Gravelford Academy from its foundation until three and a half years ago, when he chose for his life work that of the ministry and entered the Walla Walla College accordingly, to prepare himself for that calling. While there he contracted the disease that resulted in his death.

His noble character and cheerful disposition made him a favorite in school and elsewhere, both at home and abroad. His life purpose was not carried out but he left on his life record a monument to his memory and an example to his friends of patiently enduring suffering, trials and disappointment. During all his afflictions he never murmured or complained, and never lost faith and confidence in Him who knows the end from the beginning, but his faith grew stronger and his hope brighter to the end. His was a beautiful life which only budded on earth to bloom in eternity. When the final moment came he suffered but a few minutes.

He was laid to rest in the Dora cemetery with many loving and sympathizing friends in attendance.

The funeral services were conducted by Elder Giddings of the Gravel Ford Academy, assisted by Elder L. F. Smith, of the U. B.
