Sad Drowning.

(Sunday's Coos Bay Times.)
Three young ladies, aged 26, 17, and 14, were drowned while bathing in Coos River near the mouth of the East Fork yesterday evening about 4:30 p. m. Several men were near the scene but none were able to save the victims. The accident was seen by many parties all of whom were unable to do anything. Several youngmen who were at the boat house, some 200 yards above the scene, ran to rescue the ladies, but upon arriving there they were so out of breath that they could do nothing. It was all over very quickly. The victims of the drowning were:

Miss Hilda Sawyer, the 17-year-old daughter of J. A. Sawyer, the hotel man of Alleghany.

Miss Margarita Sawyer, the 14-year-old sister of Miss Hilda.

Miss Ethel Galbreth, of Prairie City, Oregon, who taught in the public school of Alleghany during the past term.

The three young ladies were in bathing some 200 yards below the C. E. Edward's boathouse when Miss Galbreth got beyond her depth in the water. She cried out frantically for help and Miss Hilda Sawyer tried to assist her but she was soon in the same condition as Miss Galbreth. Then Miss Margarita tried to assist her sister and was likewise carried into the deeper water, resulting in the death of all three.

As soon as possible after the accident the bodies of the three unfortunates were taken from the water with boat hooks, a skiff being used in this work.

The bodies were quickly placed on the bank and every method known was tried in an effort to resuscitate the victims but without success. Miss Gracey Gould was near the scene and she assisted in the work of resuscitation.

Dr. Horsfall was phoned for but it was impossible to obtain a boat at the time. He left for the scene about 8:30 p. m.

Dr. Richardson, who was at the Maze, was also telephoned to come to the scene. He immediately responded, but when he arrived on the scene medical aid counted for naught.

Miss Galbreth, who was the first to get into the dangerous depths, was taken out of the river without any signs of life. The Sawyer girls showed signs of life, especially Miss Margarita, whose life it was hoped for some time could be saved.

Captain C. E. Edwards and J. E. Lewis the undertaker, went up to Alleghany about midnight last night to bring the body of Miss Galbreth to this city for embalming and to await information as to disposition desired by her parents who have been notified of the death of their daughter.—The Coos Bay Times.

On Saturday last, at about the noon hour, Peter Nelson, the Bandon blacksmith and all-round mechanic, ended his worldly career by first taking a quantity of carbolic acid and then shooting himself in the head with a revolver. The cause of the rash act is supposed to have been family troubles brought on by hard drink, on the part of the deceased.

Mr. Nelson was well-known throughout this and Curry counties and stood high among a large circle of friends and associates, being a prominent member of the Masons and Knights, the latter lodge conducting the funeral, which took place at Bandon on Monday. He was about fifty years of age and leaves a wife and five daughters, Mrs. Philipot, Mrs. Geo. Lorenz, and the Misses Mamie, Verna and Vera, and son Harold to mourn his sad untimely taking off.
