### Chicago, Aug. 15.—Professor Jas. H. Broadstead, Egyptologist of the University of Chicago, announces that the "oldest fixed date in history" is 4241 B. C. In that year, he says, the calendar was established, the year beginning on what would now be July 19. Consequently the calendar now in use was 6147 years old last month. The professor arrived at these conclusions during his long exploration trip in the Nile Valley, when he compared the astronomical data in the old and middle kingdoms of Egypt.
