**Arizona's River Flooding Again**

Phoenix, A. T., Dec., 29.—Drizzling rains during several days culminated in a heavy precipitation here last night and today. The Gila and Salt rivers have been rising rapidly, the floods equalling those of early December.

This afternoon about 5 o'clock two tents of the Maricopa and Phoenix Railroad bridge over the Gila River were swept away and the water is still raising. It is expected that more tents will go out tonight and that traffic will be stopped indefinitely.

A train from Maricopa crossed less than an hour before the breaking of the bridge, and Superintendent Bricknell of the railroad company crossed an hour later. Though the water was high, the bridge then seemed to be in perfect condition.

Mails for California will be sent via the Santa Fe.

A flood of about three million inches is coming down Salt River.

At noon a telephone message from Roosevelt announced that eleven feet of water was racing over the dam site and that the flood was rising.

Contractor O'Rourke had scarcely finished repairing the coffer dam above the site of the storage dam swept out in the last flood, and though all is under water, it is supposed this structure is again destroyed.
