Apple Growing Hereabout.

With conditions so favorable to 1 50 apple growing in this section of 2 30 Coos county there is wonder expressed by visitors from the horti-32 40 cultural belts that so little attention is paid to the calling by our otherwise industrious farmers. One ru-1 70 ralist with whom we conversed on ralist with whom we conversed on the subject admitted the seeming indifference, but apologized by saying that dairying better paid, was better understood, and brought quicker and oftener returns. The explanation was very true, still it would seem there should be more and better looking or hards than and better looking or sards than we have. The farmer in question further stated that apples were once a larger product of our section but suffered reputation in the markets, not because of inferior quality but because of inferior packing and marketing. As a result the orchards for most part were neglected or 27 00 a larger product of our section but for most part were neglected or abandoned and ranchers turned 43 50 their attention to dairying. Fruitgrowing is a remunerative pursuit where it can be carried on successfully and is intelligently handled.
