## Visit Cape Blanco Light-House.

Good, Miss Callie Chandler, Master Louis Knapp and the Tribune family enjoyed a visit to the light-house and wireless station at Cape Blanco last Sunday, where they were hospitably received by those in charge and shown the interesting features of these two important government institutions. After a short but pleasant call at the home of Mr. Langlois, the veteran keeper of 32 years experience, the party were escorted to the tower and shown the workings of the light which is of first class power and can be seen from the deck of a vessel 23 miles at sea, and the absence of a speck of dirt on the floors or glass was noticed by the ladies of the party who were favorably impressed with the house-keeping qualities of the keeper. At the wireless station, or rather "wire" station, as there are wires everywhere, the party were graciously received by Operator H. F. Meachen and Electrician W. J. Emmons and wife, and the operator's comprehensive explanation of this wonderful invention was eagerly listened to by the hearers. Communication was established with other stations and each member of the visiting party took turns in listening to the faint click of distant stations sending messages one to the other.
