Roseburg, Or., Sept. 13.—A doublehead-on collision, in which five Japanese lost their lives and five were seriously injured, occurred at Dillard station, ten miles south of Roseburg, at 6:10 P. M. yesterday. The railroad company lost one of its big new engines and five cars. Extra east No. 2543, in charge of Conductor Dixon and Engineer Sharp had orders to meet southbound freight No. 221 at the passing track at Dillard to let southbound passenger No. 11 pass them. An extra construction gang, in charge of Foreman C. Davis, was stationed on this passing track with five construction cars. As nearly as can be learned, No. 221 headed in and started to push the construction cars out just as No. 2543 pulled in from the south. The extra tried its air and attempted to stop, but the air would not work and it ran through the open switch and collided with the construction cars, which were mashed like egg shells.

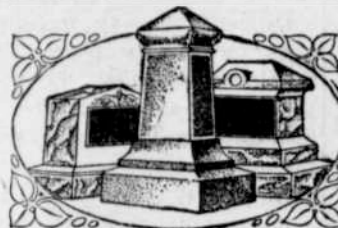

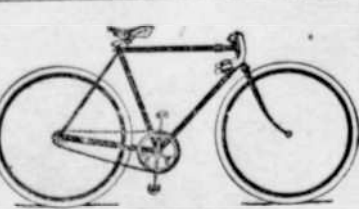
