## NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received for the construction of a bridge or plank way across Carlson Creek and Marsh in Road Dist. No. 1, according to plans and specifications as follows: Width of bridge 10 feet, with a turn-out at middle 16 feet wide and of sufficient length for teams to pass, length of bridge about 610 feet. Posts at least 6 inches square shall be set 4 feet in the ground and shall extend above ground on the bank of the creek 4 1/2 feet and continue to foot hill on even grade; 3 posts to the bent and bents 10 feet apart, except across creek, caps of 3x8 inch cedar shall be drift-bolted to posts, and three stringers 3x10 inch tongued into caps. Posts, caps and stringers to be of red cedar. Decking shall be of 3x12 inch fir spiked thoroughly into the stringers with at least 6 spikes to the plank, spikes to be 6 inches long.
