Booze and Anti Booze.

A Chicago dispatch of late date says: "With the opening of the Coliseum today of the first National Pure Beverage exposition, backed by the brewing, distilling and bottling concerns of the country, a determined warfare between the liquor and the temperance elements has been precipitated. A rival exhibition has been arranged in an adjoining building, within the zone of light of the Coliseum's electric signs, by the Woman's Christian Temperance Union and the Young People's Christian Temperance Union. These determined organizations will carry the warfare into the camp of the enemy, and, to counteract the literature being distributed by the brewers and distillers, will circulate temperance tracts right at the door of the beverage show. "Unless the visitors headed for the beverage show are careful, they may find themselves surrounded, not by elaborate booths containing bottled goods, but in a hall containing scores of diagrams and impressive facts and figures calculated to set forth the dangers which beset those who dally with the "demon rum." Pretty girls and music and decorations galore have been utilized as allurement by the promoters of the rival exposition and a merry war is in prospect. Most of the liquor men accept the rivalry in a good natured spirit and are confident that it will help, rather than hurt the beverage show. One exhibit in the temperance show, however, is calculated to brook their enthusiasm, and that is the great map setting forth the gains made in "dry" territory, in the last few years. "A national beverage show is an innovation in this country, although such exhibitions are common in Germany and other European countries. The show will be educational, in that it will afford the public an opportunity to become acquainted with what it drinks, how it is prepared and what it contains. Not only alcoholic drinks are shown and demonstrated, but tea and coffee take their place beside beer and champagne. By actual test the harmfulness of many beverages sold at fountains as pure thirst-relieving concoctions will be illustrated. In many cases the machinery used in the production of beverages has been installed. "It is said that of the 91,743 drinks of all varieties in the world there are 6397 different kinds of purely alcoholic stimulants. Among the latter beer is said to be most popular, and as a consumer of it the United States takes a high place although figures show that this country has a comparatively lower percentage of drunkenness than any other nation. "Practically every kind of food-the beverage show promoters point out, contains more or less alcohol, but it is alleged that there are an alarming number of so-called soft drinks that contain poisons much more harmful and deadly than alcohol. "The government is represented at the exposition and has established a testing station, by means of which it will furnish an analysis of everything exhibited. The means the government experts employ to protect the people from adulterated and health-destroying beverages, under the pure food and drink act will also be thoroughly explained."

Largest Building on Earth.
Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 31.—This city, with a population of only 100,000 is to give the world its greatest building. This building will be more than twice as big as the Mammoth Grand Central station being built in New York, will stand 24 stories high and cover a total ground area of more than 48 acres. The Imperial building, as it is to be known, is to have a breadth of 200 feet and a length of 415 feet. It will stand at the edge of a high bluff overlooking the waters of the Puget sound. A great wing will reach out to the water front. The landward end of the building will be 175 feet below ground, so that only 10 stories will appear above the earth's surface at this end. The top floor of the imperial building will be occupied by a hotel; next will come department stores and shops of all kinds; lower down there will be a wholesale establishments; still lower manufactures and the lower level store rooms and freight handling departments. Four transcontinental railroads enter the building, the northern Pacific on the sixth floor, the Harriman lines, the Chicago Milwaukee & St. Paul, and the Chicago and Northwestern, which is building to the coast will also make passenger terminals in the Imperial building. Power for factories in the Imperial building will be generated by the Nisqually river near Tacoma, 10,000 horsepower being required to run the building. Street car lines will run through the building on the six, eleventh and fourteenth floors by means of arched thoroughfares. The cost is estimated at \$6,000,000.

\$3,000,000,000 In Oregon Timber.

One of the items of wealth of which Oregon boasts and of which we justly feel proud is her timber, which is estimated at 300,000,000,000 feet board measurement, and worth \$3,000,000,000. These figures are given out by Chas. E. Fields, of Portland, who gets his figures from government reports. "This timber, at the present rate of consumption, not allowing for the growth it will make, will last 150 years," Mr. Fields says. Of course the rate of denuding will increase as the years go by, but even then the value of standing timber in Oregon is so vast that there is not money enough in the whole United States to buy it at present prices based on \$12 a thousand feet. "The timber of the state is worth \$3,000,000,000, or about the sum total of the national debt at the close of our Civil war. Very few of us stop to think about this, and it is only by hunting the government figures that a correct estimate can be made. "But we have other things besides timber that run into dollars pretty fast. There was a time when we thought clover could not be raised in the Willamette valley at all. Last harvest we raised 1,500,000 pounds, which at 11 cents a pound, would run up to \$165,000. Yet clover is only an incidental source of revenue. I am not figuring today on livestock, dairy products, grain or gold."
