Veteran of Indian War

W. G. W. Orr, who has been sick for some months, passed away at his home in Myrtle Point last Sunday night and his funeral was held from the Brethern church Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, interment being in the Myrtle Point cemetery.

William George Washington Orr was born at Little Rock, Arkansas, April 17, 1835 and was therefore 72 years, 11 months and 14 days old at the time of death. He crossed the plains to Oregon in the year 1855, locating in the Willamette valley in polk county. That same year he volunteered to serve in the Indian war and took an active part in that campaign for seven months and four days. He moved from Polk county to Shasta county, California, where, in 1868 he married Miss Hanna Strong who survives him. Seven children, four daughters and three sons were born of the union. Five of the children survive, all but one being married. Three of them were present at the funeral. Mr. and Mrs. Orr moved to Coos county in the year 1863, and have made this their home most of the time since, having lived at brief intervals elsewhere, but always returning to this section.

The surviving children are John and Ed Orr and Mrs. Leander Barklow of this place, Jeff Orr and Mrs. Allen of Comstock, this state.—Enterprise.
