### Death of Joseph G. Wright.

Mrs. M. J. Krantz and brother Thos. P. Wright of Gravel Ford have received the sad news from Lodi, California, of the death of their father Joseph G. Wright, caused by a stroke of paralysis. In May of last year he received a paralysis stroke which left him almost an invalid and in the afternoon of March the 20th this year he suffered another stroke from which he died a few hours later.

Grandpa Wright as he was familiarly known was one of Oregon's old and respected pioneers having come here in the year 1870, and will be well remembered by many old friends in Coos county, Curry and Douglas counties.

He was born in Laport county Ind. May the 16th, 1832, and was therefore seventy-five years ten months and four days, at the time of his death.

Grandpa Wright had been a devout Christian for over forty years and was esteemed and honored by all who knew him. He was a loving husband, kind father and a good neighbor; he leaves a sorrowing wife, two daughters and five sons, besides a large number of grandchildren and great grandchildren.

S. McCulloch. Bids will be received up to the 6th day of May, 1908, at 10:00 o'clock a. m. of said day. Said bids to be for removing rock and dirt and making roadbed, clearing roadway by cubic yards and also for clearing road way rock work and making road bed complete by lineal rods. Work to begin at the stake or station No. 46 and continuing on the line of said road until the special tax levied for said improvements shall be exhausted.

### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Notice is hereby given that the Beaver Slough Drainage District will receive sealed bids for the construction of a drainage system in said district, in Coos County, Oregon, which will include the following:

One ditch 416 feet long, 36 feet wide on the bottom, at the river bank, being the outlet of said proposed drainage system.

One ditch 2640 feet long, 24 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 3564 feet long, 6 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 5730 feet long, 20 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 1968 feet long, 10 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 7776 feet long, 24 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 3696 feet long, 10 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 3102 feet long, 6 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

One ditch 3826 feet long, 6 feet wide and 3½ feet deep, approximately.

Containing approximately in all 80,000 cubic yards, and all ditches to be excavated to the level of extreme low tide.

The construction of one dyke on the upper portion of Beaver slough 4000 feet long, 4½ feet high, 2 feet wide on top and slope of 45°.

The construction of one dyke 212 feet long, across mouth of slough on upper portion of J. A. Davenport's land, at river bank, to be 2 feet higher than river bank, 10 feet wide on top and slope of sides 45°.

The construction of a dyke at the mouth of China Camp Creek, 30 feet long, 2 feet higher than river bank at that place, 10 feet wide on top and slope of sides 45°.

One tide gate at the mouth of main ditch.

The clearing of land and removal of all stumps necessary for all ditches, dykes and tide gates.

All ditches to be dug and all dykes constructed along the lines and at the places indicated by the plans, map and survey of said drainage system now on file in the office of the County Clerk for Coos County, Oregon.

Bids will be considered for the complete system or any portion thereof.

Any and all successful bidders will, before commencement of work, be required to enter into a written contract, and give a bond with good and sufficient sureties for the faithful performance of their contracts.
