EDITOR HERALD: I see 'Citizen' has broken forth in your columns also and his article in this instance is on an equal basis with the one published by your contemporary. Who is this 'Citizen' any way, who knows so much and yet is too cowardly to sign his name?

First, he says the amendments offered are unconstitutional. If he will take the trouble to investigate the matter he will find that these amendments are proposed according to the provisions of law. See session laws 1907, page 407.

Then he "sities" us to a certain section of the proposed amendments which are now, always have been and will still be a part of our city charter, whether these amendments are adopted by the people or not. And so it is all the way through his article. He does not once touch upon any questions which are to be changed by the amendments. In other words, he is trying to discuss something of which he knows absolutely nothing. He does not know anything about the provisions of our present charter and wherein the proposed amendments will change them.

His idea that these amendments "are a very cunningly devised plan to defeat the growth of the city and enable its officers to squander the city's money" is the silliest proposition of all his statements. Whose money do they propose to squander, if any body's? Are not the members of the council a part of the people? Are they not all taxpayers? Would they desire a plan whereby the officers could squander their own money which they pay in as taxes? Again who is this 'Citizen'? Does he pay a cent of taxes? If he is so wise, why does he not propose a "rew out and out charter based upon a more popular idea?"

It is proper that these proposed amendments should be discussed, but let us have them discussed by some one who has some slight knowledge of what he is discussing. Yours very truly,

Flood Wiped out Village.

Helena, April 17.—A special to the Record says that the flood waters from Hauser Lake are passing great Falls without doing great damage, the deepening of the channel by dynamite serving to carry off the excess waters. General Manager Goodall of the Boston & Mountain Company states the great smelter will not be damaged.

The situation at raig is very serious. The town is destroyed and its one hundred inhabitants have taken refuge in the hills. With the exception of the school house, practically every building there has been destroyed.

The work of repairing the dam has begun. It is estimated that the work will require six months and cost \$200,000.
