Secretary Walter Lyon of the Marsh. field Chamber of Commerce, late today received the following self-explanatory telegram from Senator

"Secretary Newburry has ordered Atlantic Battleship fleet to stop off Coos Bay, the weather permitting,' Arrangements will be immediate-

ly begun for Coos Bay people to welcome the vessels even though they do not come into this barbor An effort will be made to have the day declared a holiday in North Bend and Marshfield as advice is received when the vessels will pass up the coast.

It is possible that the Breakwiter, Eureka or Alliance, which ever one happens to be in port at the time, may be chartered to take some North Bend and Marshfield people out to see the fleet.

Many others are planning to go to Cape Arago or Sunset Bay and view the passing fleet from there. Some are planning to make it a picnic day, taking their lunches and enjoying a holiday.

Much will depend on the weather and the hour that the fleet will pass up the coast en route to Seattle .-Coos Bay Timer.
