Because when the U.S. customs officer came to that town a number of law-breaking \$100. "boot-leggers," in order to escape appearing before the grand jury at Portland, paid \$25 for a license, though some of them had perhaps never sold more than one bottle of booze. Similar instances have occurred in Coquille.
