COOS BAY NEWS.

W. S. Chandler is expected from the city on the next plant.

The city council has limited the number of saloons in Marshfield to 13.

The contract for building the Hotel Chandler, at Marshfield, has been let to Olsen & Johnson, of Portland. It will be built of brick, and work is to commence at once.

An accident occurred in the Beaver Hill mine, Wednesday, resulting in the death of an Italian miner named Antony Rizaldi. The funeral took place at Marshfield on Friday.

A postoffice is to be opened at Cooston in the near future, and W. E. Homme has been appointed postmaster. Cooston is on the east side of the bay, and the postoffice will be a great accommodation to residents of Willanch slough and vicinity.

More horses are arriving for the races on the 3d and 4th. The track is in better shape than ever before, and new buildings, grand stand, etc., are under way. Trotters, pacers and gallopers are in training, and some lively contests for the purses are assured.

A sad accident occurred at East-side, Friday evening, resulting in the death by drowning of Thompson Vapesick, a late arrival on the bay, aged 21 years. He was employed at the Smith mill, and had crossed Iathmus slough in a skiff to East-side, where he was stopping. While attempting to land he fell overboard, and it is supposed he drifted under a boom of logs, as he never came to the surface afterwards. All attempts to recover the body have failed up to the present.
