The dredger will be completed August 5th and about 10 days will be required for equipping and testing, when it will be ready to start south. The Southern Pacific has agreed to tow the craft to this port free of charge. It will have a capacity of 6600 cubic yards, per day of 8 hours, in ordinary work, but in soft mud this amount will be increased from 25 to 50 per cent.—Marshfield Sun.
