Decedent was one of the best known and most highly respected pioneer women of Southwestern Oregon, having crossed the plains in 1845 with her mother and father, the late Isham Cox, who died down in Curry in 1874. Mrs. Hall's husband, Wm. Hall, died at the bay in 1892. She leaves several children to mourn the passing of a devoted and honored mother.
