Children Must Go to School.

Parents are liable to arrest and punishment by fine and imprisonment if they do not send their children to school throughout the school year. The law was changed by the last legislature, and many do not know that it is much more drastic than it was formally.

Parents, guardians and others having control of children are charged with the duty of sending every child between the ages of 6 and 14, and all between 14 and 16 who are not regularly engaged in some useful employment, to school. Children who are physically unfit must exhibit to the truant officer a certificate of a competent physician.

The penalty imposed on parents for neglecting to send their children to school is a fine of \$5 to \$25; 2 to 10 days in the city or county jail, or both fine and jail sentence.

Teachers, principals and school officers are charged by the new law under the penalty of a fine, with reporting to the truant officer all information they have regarding any violation of the school law, and all cases of children who do not attend school. Teachers who fail to obey the law in these respects may be fined from \$5 to \$20 for each offense .- Review.
