Coos County's Assessment.

Below we give the summary of Coos county's assessment as lately returned by Assessor Thirt, which shows the development and growth in values in the county as compared with those of last year. They read as follows:

The valuation of the assessable property for this year, as will be seen, amounts to \$14,069,071, after deducting the exemption of \$148,685. Last year the total assessment was \$13,536,261 with no exemptions allowed, but if the same exemption is taken from last year's assessment, it then shows an increase in the values of the property in Coos county to be \$828,180, which is encouraging from the fact that business was more lively last year than this.

Last year's money assessed amounted to \$16,434. This year we have \$53,770. Last year accounts and notes amounted to \$279,755. This year's return is \$295,595, a difference of only \$15,840. The rolls show the following summary for 1908:

Tillable acres, 16,845; untillable lands, \$544,630. Town and City lots, \$2,732,009. Improvements on lots, \$897,620. Improvements on lands not deeded, \$16,465. Miles of railroad bed, 47, valued at \$184,900; miles of telephone, 313, valued at \$6,404; railroad rolling stock valued at \$39,425; steamboats, stationary engines and manufacturing machinery valued at \$389,843; merchandise and stock in trade valued at \$328,760; farming implements, wagons, carriages, etc., \$41,860; money on hand, \$53,770; notes and accounts, \$295,595; shares of stock, \$56,485; household furniture, watches, jewelry, etc., \$159,852; 2365 horses and mules, \$94,670; 13,487 cattle, \$178,365; sheep and goats, 7186, valued at \$10,817; 2265 swine at \$3,473; 494 dogs at \$3,497; exemption, \$148,685. Total value of all property, \$14,069,071.
