Rockefeller as Model.

New York, April 1.—Two hundred and sixteen young men entered business and industrial struggle in New York today with the life of John D. Rockefeller before them as a model. R. Fulton Cutting, in an address last night at the graduating exercises of the New York Trade School pictured Mr. Rockefeller, not as the unrelenting trust magnate, but as an example of what persistency and temperance may accomplish. He said:

"Take John D. Rockefeller for a model as you go through life; bear in mind that he started in a humble position at a very small salary, and, by patience, hard work and perseverance won his way to the top. Also abstain from drink, don't gamble, and go to church. Then you must succeed."

Another Girl to Marry Jap.

New York, March 30.—This city has a sensation something akin to the Aoki affair in which Miss Helen Emery—now Mrs. Aoki—of San Francisco, was involved. Miss Anice Smith, a pretty young woman of a good family, has declared her intention of marrying Gilbert Fudji, a Japanese student of Columbia college. Fudji is a well to do and well educated Jap and the girl has declared that she has not the slightest objection to marrying him. Public opinion is against the match.

BUT NEGRESS WANTS DIVORCE.

Spokane, Wash., March 30.—Ray Davis Yoshioka, a negress, who is being sued by her husband, a Japanese tailor, for divorce, upon allegations of unfaithfulness, petitioned the court today to require her husband to pay her \$250 for attorney's fees, \$100 suit money and \$50 a month alimony to enable her to prepare her defense.

She declares that immediately after their marriage, March 6, her husband treated her in an inhuman manner. He commenced the divorce suit within a week from the date of the wedding.

Government Goes After Trust.

New York, N. Y., April 2.—A reassessment of duties amounting to a total increase of \$1,239,000 on the sugar imported by the American Sugar Refining Company at the refinery of Havemeyer & Elder, between December, 1901, and November, 1907, has been ordered by Collector Loeb of the Port of New York.

In addition to the assessment of \$1,239,000, the government claims to have been defrauded out of about \$500,000 in duties on the sugar weighed at the refinery of Meyer & Elder in Brooklyn and \$500,000 in duties on the sugar weighed at the Jersey City refinery prior to 1901. Legal steps are now being taken in behalf of the government to force the collection of these duties.

A Missourian's Lament.

A North Missouri farmer whose hog was killed by a train wrote to the company's train agent for a settlement. He penned his communication this: "Dear Sir—My razorback strolled down your track a week ago today. Your twenty-nine came down the line and snuffed his life away. You can't blame me, the hog, you see, slipped through a cattle gate, so kindly pen a check for ted, he died to liquidate." He received the following reply: "Old twenty-nine came down the line and killed your hog we know, but razorbacks on railroad tracks quite often meet with woe.
