A large throng of his friends gathered to pay the last tribute of respect to one whom they had learned to love and respect. Rev. S. B. Hollenbeak, whom he had intimately known for thirty years, preached the funeral sermon. The deceased was 83 years of age last

Mr. Hayes, with his good wife by his side, experienced all the vicissitudes, hardships and dangers which t fel the pioneer who crossed the plains by team fifty years ago. He w s a successful trader with the Indians, while altercations were not always avoidable, and he knew more of their traits, traditions and language than most men who came among them in earlier days.




