### FAIR NOTES

Things That May Be Seen at the Seattle Exposition.

Seattle, July 28.—Governor C. E. Hughes of New York will be one of the distinguished visitors at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition on New York Day, Monday, August 2. In the New York building for which the legislature of that state appropriated \$120,000, a brilliant program will be held.

Monday will also be Kentucky Day and a program with many pleasing features has been prepared. The Seattle corn-crackers have organized a Kentucky Club to entertain the visiting delegation.

Snohomish County and Everett will have a celebration lasting two days on Tuesday and Wednesday, August 3 and 4. It is estimated that 15,000 people from Snohomish County will be in attendance at the fair. The Everett Chamber of Commerce is energetically booming the event, in the hope of surpassing the Tacoma Day record.

Tuesday will be Minnesota Day at the Exposition and Governor John A. Johnson will take part in the program. Governor Johnson timed his visit to the Exposition to be present on Swedish Day on August 31, and on Scandinavian Day on August 2.

The Woodmen of the World will hold one of the largest fraternal celebrations at the Exposition on Tuesday, August 3.

The Seattle Lodge is counting on an attendance of nearly 20,000 from all parts of the country. The Women of Woodcraft will hold their day on Wednesday.

Governor E. F. Nash of Mississippi will be present on Mississippi Day on Wednesday, August 4. The Mississippi citizens in Seattle have organized a club and are arranging for a fitting reception.

Wednesday will be Olympia Day and also Shelton Day. Both of these cities are expecting to send considerable delegations to the Exposition.

Alaska Children's Day on Thursday will be celebrated by the Alaskans. A program in the Arctic Brotherhood building will be a feature of the day.

Chehalis County Day on Friday will be the occasion for the arrival of a large delegation from the Gray's Harbor country. Chehalis County has been one of the foremost countries in joining in the Exposition work. The county has one of the most attractive of the county buildings and also an excellent exhibit in the Agriculture building.

Lewiston, Idaho, will have Friday at the Exposition. A special train has been chartered.

Illinois Day will be celebrated on Friday and Saturday will be Indiana Day.

Renton, Wash., is planning on closing all of its business houses on Saturday so that its citizens can visit the Exposition then.

Seattle, July 28.—Governor John A. Johnson of Minnesota, the idol of the Scandinavian people of the United States and one of the most likely candidates for the presidency will visit the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition for a week following Swedish Day on July 31.

Governor Johnson has timed his visit so that he will be present at Swedish Day on Saturday, July 31, Scandinavian Day, on the following Monday, and Minnesota State Day on Tuesday.

His presence will be the cause of the largest gathering of Scandinavian people ever brought together on the Coast. Swedish-Americans and Norwegian-Americans from all parts of the Northwest are making arrangements to visit the Fair during Governor Johnson's visit.

In the program of Swedish and Scandinavian days at the Exposition, Governor Johnson will be the central figure. On account of his famed oratorical ability he will be

called on for frequent addresses. The address of welcome to the Scandinavian people on Monday will be given by President Chilberg of the Exposition and responded to by Governor Johnson. The coincidence that both of these men are Scandinavians will add to the success of the program.

### Spanish Meets Defeat.

Madrid, Spain, July 29.—Official dispatches admit that in a battle between the Moorish tribesmen and Spanish forces outside Melilla, July 27, the Spanish met a disastrous defeat. The Moors cut off the communications of the Spanish outposts with the main force of Spaniards which was driven back under the walls of the city where the fighting continued desperately. The Spanish killed and wounded number almost three thousand which takes no account of the men at the advance posts, who were evidently cut off and abandoned to their fate.

The extent of the disaster is plainly shown from General Marina's dispatch in which he admits being repulsed and concludes by saying his losses were General Pintos, a colonel, two lieutenants-colonels, five captains, many officers of lower rank and about 1,000 men, the wounded numbering at least fifteen hundred, including many officers. Two generals were mortally wounded.
