While this Congress will discuss several matters of interest to the two states concerned, the feature of prime importance will be the best plans for furthering the early construction of the Coos Bay to Boise Railroad. The Roseburg delegation will co-operate with the Coos Bay people in the development of this important project and assure them that Roseburg and Douglas county will give every possible assistance for its early consummation.

Development of the boundless natural resources of this portion of Oregon is seriously retarded by lack of a direct means of transportation between the interior and the coast and the building of a railroad is the only means to relieve this condition. It is now generally realized that the starting of the Drain road two or three years ago was a colossal bluff to "kill off" a road between here and Coos Bay. That "bluff" finally accomplished its purpose and work on the Drain road stopped. As soon as another railroad to Coos Bay is started, the Drain road will doubtless be pushed on through, and not before. The peo ple back of the Coos Bay to Boise project fully realize this and when once started the building of this road will go right ahead, regardless of whether Mr. Harriman completes his line from Drain to Coos Bay or not. We would like to see both roads built and the present indications are, said to be very favorable.

Art Johnson Suicides.
