Daniel Hayward of Empire, another Coos County pioneer, died Sunday morning at 5 o'clock. Mr. Hayward entered this county in the early 50's and has resided in Empire over 40 years. He died of apoplexy having suffered several attacks since last March the one last Friday proving fatal.

She is royally bred and has in her veins the best blood of the most noted Jerseys. She was sired by Coomassie's Oxford Lad. T. S. Cooper & Sons, of Coopersburg, Pennsylvania, at a recent sale, sold fifteen daughters of Oxford Lad at an average of \$946.00 each, the highest price being \$2,525.00. President Taft's cow is solid color except small spot on left flank, black switch. Coomassie Oxford Lad 66867 was bred by P. J. Picot, Trinity, Island of Jersey. Mr. Ranney delivered the cow to the President's summer residence at Beverly, Massachusetts, taking her in a special car.—The Farm Home.

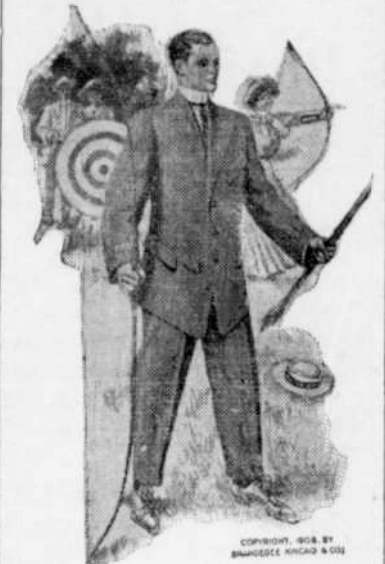
