Lane County Pioneer Dies.

Uncle Sam Handsaker, one of the best known of Lane county pioneers, died at Dexter, this county, Tuesday, October 5, 1909, after a ingering illness due to old age.

Uncle Sam was born at Hatton, Derbyshire, England, November 19, 1831, and was therefore 77 years, 10 months and 16 days old. Deceased came to this country in 1843, landing at New Orleans March 28 of that year with his mother, two sisters and two brothers. Ten years later the Oregon fever, then a prevalent contagion throughout the east, brought him west from the old home near St. Coos Awarded Prizes at A-Y-P. A logging camp is being conducted Louis, coming across the plains by pioneer spirit when he volunteered under Captain Laban Buoy, Company B, 2nd regiment Oregon mounted volunteers, and later did similar service under Captain P. C. Noland. In 1856 the Indians were subdued and peace declared.
