Geo. R. Wasson Dies.

George R. Wasson, a resident of Coos County since 1852, died at his ranch on South Slough this morning of complications due to his advanced years. He had recently celebrated his eighty-sixth birthday. He was one of the oldest pioneers of this section and was a veteran of the Rogue River war. He was taken ill last Tuesday with a slight attack of pleurisy and he rapidly weakened until death finally claimed him.

Mr. Wasson was born in Blissfield, Marimachi county, New Brunswick, September 6, 1823, and sailed around Cape Horn to California in 1849. In 1852 he came to Coos Bay and had made his home here ever since. He is survived by a wife and several children, the latter being Mrs. Ira Metcalf of Riverton, Miss Nellie Wasson of Marshfield, John Wasson of South Slough, James Wasson, Thomas Wasson, Mrs. Chas. Codding, George Wasson and Mrs. Frank Tanner. Other relatives who survive are two sisters, Mrs. Martha Parker of Derby, N. B., and Mrs. McAllister of Newcastle, N. B., and two brothers, James Wasson of Golden, B. C., and John Wasson of Minneapolis. The funeral will be held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the ranch on South Slough, his desire being to be buried near the old homestead. A special boat will leave Marshfield for there at 9 o'clock Monday morning.—Coos Bay Times.

A Bad Fire.

Philadelphia, Jan. 19.—With estimates that from 25 to 40 girls were burned to death or were killed by leaping from windows, a fire which destroyed the Ellis building today, trapped at least 500 young women, was the worst disaster this city has known in years. Eight girls are known to have been killed by jumping from the windows of the second and third floors. "The number of dead must be more than 40," declared Fire Chief Nexter this afternoon, after making as thorough an investigation as was possible at the time.

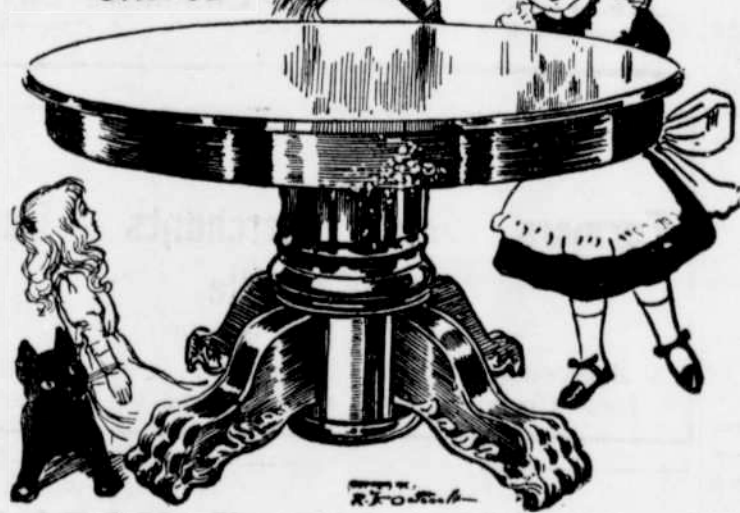
