George R. Wasson, a resident of Coos County since 1852, died at his whereabouts of William Costelo ranch on South Slough this morn. He was one of the oldest pioneers of this section and was a veteran of the Rogue River war. He was taken ill last Tuesday with a slight attack of pleurisy and he rapidly weakened until death finallyclaimed

Mr. Wasson was born in Blissfield, Marimachi county, New Brunswick, September 6, 1823, and sailed around Cape Horn to California in 1849. A Bad Fire.

Philadelphia, Jan. 19,-With estimates that from 25 to 40 girls were hurned to death or were killed by leaping from windows, a fire which destroyed the Ellis building today, trapped at least 500 young women, was the worst disaster this city has known in years. Eight girls are known to have been killed by jumping from the windows of the second and third floors.

"The numbr of dead must be more than 40," declared Fire Chief Naxter this afternoon, after making as thorough an investigation as was possible at the time.
