## Chas. A. Peterson, Sr. Dies.

Again it becomes our duty to record the passing of another Coos county pioneer, a well-known and highly respected citizen of Riverton. Mr. Peterson was a native of Scotland, and was an old-time coal miner, having worked over fifty years under ground, having spent a number of years in Pennsylvania before coming to the Pacific coast.

Mr. Peterson has been growing feeble for about two years, but his case was not regarded as serious until a month or so ago, since when he had grown weaker and weaker until the end came at about 10 o'clock Saturday night. He had passed his 78th birthday but three days before his death.

The deceased was for many years a resident of Riverton where he opened and developed a good farm as well as a coal mine or two, which were evidences of his skill and good judgment in that line. He leaves a wife, three sons and one daughter, E. M. Charles and Harry Peterson and Mrs. M. W. McCormick.

The funeral services were conducted at the home in Riverton yesterday forenoon and the interment took place in the I. O. O. F. cemetery at this place at 11 o'clock on the arrival of the steamer Dispatch, which bore the remains to this city, as well as a large number of his friends from Riverton and other lower river points, who came to pay the last tribute of respect to their old friend.

## Teachers Training School.

The necessary finances to pay the instructors has been arranged for, and the most competent instructors obtainable will be secured. This grew out of a resolution in the district board convention last August and will no doubt prove a very valuable thing for our teachers.
