About Drainage.

J. W. Mast, secretary of the Fat Elk Drainage District, was up from Bandon Saturday, remaining until Monday. Mr. Mast is highly pleased with the progress being made by the dredging gang, the work of the entire system being over half completed. He is also highly elated over the manner in which it is taking the water from the fine bottom lands of the district. Since the main ditch was cut through to what is called the lake, the water in it has fallen about four feet, and the surrounding lands have dried up in a corresponding manner. Many hundreds of acres will now be fine tillable soil which have heretofore been too wet for cropping purposes.

It is but a matter of a few years until the Fat Elk marshes will be known as one of the finest farming sections in the state, as it is the determination of the farmers of that locality to clear these lands and have them in a fine state of cultivation, when this will become a very prolific dairy section. The same conditions prevail in the Beaver slough District, where Mr. Larsen recently completed a system of ditches almost equal to this in extent, and which drains an equally extensive tract of marshland.
